Dr. Jung is one of the world's foremost researchers in biomedical and neural engineering, has led multiple transdisciplinary research teams and grants, has more than 100 refereed publications, and 14 U.S. patents. A champion for innovation and entrepreneurship, she develops devices that lead to scientific advances with clear pathways to clinical application.

Congratulations Dr. Paul D. Adams



Paul D. Adams, professor in the Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry in the U of A's Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences and the Cell and Molecular Biology Program in the Graduate School and International Education, was selected to be the 10th Charles Darwin Diversity in Science Lecture at Indiana State University.

For 10 years now, the Department of Biology at Indiana State University has been cultivating partnerships and building a science community that exemplifies the spirit of experiential learning and community engagement. Through partnerships on and off campus, the Charles

Darwin Diversity in Science Lecture speaker series was developed to spark interest and broaden the scope of scholarship opportunities between students, faculty and the public in the Wabash Valley.

"I am very honored by this invitation to represent the University of Arkansas while speaking about the work we have been doing in my laboratory centered around protein biochemistry and biophysics," Adams said. "I am also happy to represent why diversity in chemistry and biology is vital as we cultivate the next generation of scientists."

Adams' lecture will highlight findings from his research at the U of A and is titled "Biophysical and Biochemical Approaches to Characterize Novel Molecular Details That Influence Ras-Related Protein Cell Signaling Function." Adams delivered the 10th Charles Darwin Diversity in Science Lecture on March 19th.
