### 4th Annual UA ENGAGE Leadership Exploration Program Concludes



The 2025 UA ENGAGE Leadership Exploration Program ended April 4th with a graduation ceremony for the program's fourth cohort. Representing five colleges across campus plus the University Libraries system, these 17 faculty members worked throughout the spring semester to complete program objectives, develop their career intentions, and build their on-campus networks.

"This group of faculty members were engaging, authentic and came to each session ready to learn and share their leadership stories. They took away a lot from the program, but our workshop leaders including myself, Fiona Goggin and Christie Craig left each session energized and inspired by the important contribution that the program is making to develop strong and capable university leaders," said Dean Kim Needy of the College of Engineering, creator of the program.

The UA ENGAGE Leadership Exploration Program, funded through NSF ADVANCE, is a semester-long workshop series that aims to help mid-career faculty evaluate which future leadership roles best align with their personal strengths and values. The four-session series is also designed to promote leadership capacity within our institution, strengthen participants' peer networks, and improve retention by offering tangible

takeaways for holistic career planning. Participants are mid-career faculty (associate or full professors) nominated by their colleges and selected based on established career success and leadership experience.

Dr. Shauna Morimoto, Associate Dean in the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences, leads the UA ENGAGE Team as PI for the NSF ADVANCE grant. "We are thrilled with another successful year for the Leadership Exploration Program! Now a mainstay on our campus, the program continues to foster talent that supports faculty success across the U of A," said Morimoto.

Participants from previous cohorts have moved into new leadership roles in administration, research, teaching, and entrepreneurial ventures, signaling the lasting value of the Leadership Exploration Program to the University of Arkansas as well as participants.

## COHEP Faculty Development Workshop Highlight



The College of Education and Health Professions recently hosted a lunch and learn session for new assistant professors about statewide education and health data. Dr. Josh McGee, associate professor of education reform and 21st Century Endowed Chair in Education Accountability and Transparency, led the discussion. McGee, who formerly served as the chief data officer for Arkansas, has extensive experience using large state data sets to conduct research and help state agencies make evidence-based decisions.

Many attendees were part of the college's first cluster hire and have research interests aimed at maximizing the health and education outcomes of students in Arkansas schools. This lunch and learn session was part of the Early-Career Faculty Research Engagement and Mentoring Program, a key action item of the college's WE CARE Strategic Plan, which launched in August 2023.
