
SEC Academic Leadership Development Program (ALDP) Conference Comes to Fayetteville!













The University of Arkansas hosted the SEC Academic Leadership Development Program's latest workshop on February 19-21. The U of A hosted the SEC ALDP Conference February 19-21, 2025. Due to inclement weather, the workshop was delivered virtually, focusing on "Leading Change and Managing Expectations." This virtual gathering brought together 80 academic leaders from institutions across the SEC, providing opportunities to engage in insightful discussions and meaningful networking in an online environment. The workshop featured expert

speakers, panel discussions, and virtual breakout sessions designed to network and explore strategies for effectively managing organizational change, setting clear expectations, and navigating the challenges faced by academic leaders today. Participants heard from several senior administrators, the Keynote Speaker Dr. Kim Needy, Dean of the College of Engineering, and gained valuable insights into best practices and practical approaches for managing change in higher education.

Announcement about Open Access Publishing Support Programs

Open access (OA) makes research freely available online to everyone – researchers, students, practitioners, patients – everywhere around the globe. However, some publishers charge fees, called article processing charges (APCs), which can pose barriers for authors who want to make their publications open.

For this reason, the University Libraries has negotiated agreements with several publishers, including Elsevier, Springer Nature and Wiley, to reduce or eliminate these charges. In addition, we have created the Open Access Publishing Fund to assist with the costs of publishing in journals that are not currently covered by these agreements.
